Olmsted County Emergency Services Nets

An ARES net is activated whenever threatening weather or other situations warrant as determined by the National Weather Service office in LaCrosse, Wisconsin, or the Olmsted County Emergency Operations Center. ARES nets are directed nets and all communications is controlled by the net control station (NCS) using a standard set of net operation procedures. Contact Rob Richter, KCØFOW, to become a ARES net control station operator.

The Olmsted county ARES net uses the RARC 146.820 repeater for emergency event activation and information. A CTCSS tone of 136.5 Hz is transmitted on the repeater to notify ARES members during overnight hours. The Olmsted County Emergency Management repeater EOC 147.255 (PL tone 100.0 Hz) is the backup for the 146.820 repeater and is also available to provide additional ARES communications.

During SKYWARN severe weather operations, the EOC 147.255 (PL 100.0 Hz) repeater is used for event activation and information. The RARC 146.820 repeater provides communications backup.

An ARES information and training net is held on Sunday evenings at 9:00 PM local time on the 146.820 repeater. All registered ARES members are required to check into the weekly training net. Any amateur radio operator in the Olmsted county area is also invited to check into the net.

NBEMS

NBEMS stands for 'Narrow Band Emergency Messaging System'. It is becoming a widely accepted standard for amateur emcomm digital communications. We use NBEMS in our Thursday night net. These tutorials show how to set up and use NBEMS: Narrow Band Emergency Messaging Software (NBEMS)

SKYWARN Severe Weather Spotting



Severe weather storm spotting and reporting in Olmsted county is coordinated by the Olmsted County Emergency Management Office.

A SKYWARN weather net is activated when a potential for severe weather is determined by the National Weather Service (NWS) in La Crosse, Wisconsin, and the Olmsted Office of Emergency Operations Center. The WØEAS 147.255 (PL tone 100.0 Hz) repeater is used for SKYWARN nets, with the WØMXW 146.820 repeater providing backup communications. A

SKYWARN net, when initiated by the EOC, may be operated from any SKYWARN trained NCS location

until the EOC net control station is activated. Mobile radios are mandatory outside the Rochester city limits and should always be operating on high power.

A county grid map (pdf) or county grid map (jpg) is required to provide spotter locations for severe weather reports. SKYWARN spotters should keep safety in mind when tracking severe weather and always leave an escape route. Never obstruct traffic, park only where it is safe, be visible, and use vehicle hazard lights or other warning lights when parked. Use SKYWARN signs to identify vehicles and do not park on private property. SKYWARN spotters are required to have attended one National Weather Service (NWS) training class, sponsored and coordinated by Olmsted County Emergency Management Office, every two years. All SKYWARN mobile spotters must be 18 years of age or older.



• **Field Day** – Dave KØVH

Old Business:

- There is a group of club members headed up by KCØGND currently reviewing and updating the club bylaws to make them more current. Nothing much is happening currently on that front. New Business:

• Dave KØVH presented the findings of the Field Day committee's investigation of what should be done at Field Day, and where it should be held. Dave mentioned that Scott KØMD and Pat NØADQ had been working on Field Day planning for the past few months. The committee was now in charge of presenting options to the club for a vote. Dave also mentioned that we need to publicize Field Day better. We need to get the word out to the media before the event happens to make the public better aware of what we do.

The options that were presented for the 2008 Field Day event were:

A motion to go with option A with a 4A or 5A station was presented. Ballots were distributed to club members to vote on a location. After an 8 minute break, the ballot count was announced. The Kasson location at Pat's farm was chosen "27 or 28 to 5". The motion passed to have Field Day at Pat's farm.

Dave KØVH passed a sign-up sheet around for people to choose what activites they would like to be involved with during Field Day.

Some interest in getting an optimal call sign for Field Day was voiced. A motion was passed that the Field Day committee decide whether the club should obtain a call sign for Field Day by next club meeting.

Stew WØSHL asked that the Technical committee investigate whether we really need to provide the auto-patch function on the 82 repeater any longer since most people have cell phones now. It was decided that since we still need the phone line to the repeater for control purposes, we essentially get the auto-patch function for free so we might as well keep it. There was no further discussion needed on the topic.

• The RARExpo committee chairs gave a brief update on the expo.

Stan KDØBQ addressed the cost of the expo. He reported on several steps that had been taken to help reduce the costs. Those included the college agreeing to co-sponsor the event, and moving the hamfest from the arena to the 15000 sq. ft. performance court space. That drove our costs way down since we no longer are required to pay for the space used. Even more cost savings have been achieved by moving the banquets to the college cafeteria.

He has some handouts that you can take to distribute at those locations so talk to him before you go.

Bob ABØBW will be putting the ARES portion of the program together. There are also some public service demos planned with the EM50. KariAnn's main goal is to make this portion of the expo interesting and appealing to the non-ham portion of the public.

Dave KØVH made further announcements relating to field day. The station will be 4A or 5A, but we need to really have all of them running 24 hours a day. We will need filters to run these stations on the same band at the same time. Multiband filters cost about \$200. A single band filter costs \$40, and could be used for the digital station.

Committee reports:

• Technical committee – Rob KCØFOW

- The 440 repeater is running fine. Still need to pull it to do maintenance on it.
- The 625 repeater is working good. The status of Echolink was not known at the time of the meeting.

- The October program will consist of a Youth in Radio presentation. The RARExpo committee will also provide an Expo summary, and Jerry Nau from College for Kids has volunteered to bring refreshments to show his gratitude for the club's support of the College for Kids program.
- The November program will be kit-build night. Please let Stan know if you are interested in this.

Committee reports:

• Technical committee – Rob KCØFOW

- The 82 backup repeater is now on the air while the actual 82 repeater is being repaired. The amp was bad. We suspect that the receiver is also bad. Both were apparently damaged by lightning strikes.
- The auto-patch is down while the 82 repeater is being repaired.
- The 625 Echolink is off-line for now.
- The 440 repeater is operational. Bob ABØBW has an IRLP node active on that repeater. He had it connected to the Hurricane Net IRLP node after Hurricane Gustav.

• Public Service – Steve WØSTV for John NØHZN

- The Treadman Duathlon will be held September 27th. Greg KCØEEU is coordinating the event. He is looking for volunteers to help.
- There are no other public service events scheduled for the remainder of the year.

• ARES – Bob ABØBW

- David WØTMP is the new AEC.
- Bob will be presenting his plan for the Rushford emergency drill during the meeting's program.
- ARES badges expire the end of 2008. Bob will be bringing the ARES list to the October meeting and will begin taking pictures for next year's badges. Please be present at the October meeting to get your ARES badge picture taken.
- We must recover the old ARES badges when the new ones are available at the end of 2008. Only the ARES badges issued for 2009 will be valid for ARES and EOC activities next year.
- ARES members are encouraged to get an ARES vest. If you need to obtain a vest please contact Bob ABØBW.

• EOC – Steve WØSTV

- Steve went through all of the old equipment in the basement of the EOC, and put most of it up for sale. The sales brought in \$800 which the EOC said we could use to buy things that we need to support the EOC such as more equipment or radar software.
- We will be using a weather radar program, as well as software that displays our spotter's APRS positions on the radar. All SKYWARN spotters are strongly encouraged to use APRS when out storm spotting. Our EOC personnel as well as the NWS in La Crosse will be able to position us and keep tabs on us better if we all use APRS.
- The last SKYWARN net is being held Wednesday September 17th at 9:00 pm on the 255 repeater. This will be a multi-county net, and the NWS La Crosse will also participate.
- There is money in the county EOC budget for a new dual band radio for the EM50. We are planning to purchase a DStar capable dual band radio so we can communicate on the DStar repeaters in the Twin Cities area if needed.

• DX and Contests – Peter N8MHD and Dave KØVH reporting for Stew WØSHL

- This coming weekend is Get Your Feet Wet Weekend. It's a slow CW contest for new people to try.
- Saturday-Sunday is the All VHF Contest. Use simplex, but not 146.52.

• Education – Bill NØNUV

- Nothing new to report at Schaeffer.
- There have been equipment donations made to the school stations including an amp and a tower.

• **RARExpo** – Stan AIØM

- The Expo committee is planning a debriefing session for the club during the October meeting.
- Some people are already talking about the possibilty of doing the Expo again in 2009. This time it would be different. We would have to rethink the flea market part of the Expo.
- Comments from various club members were that most people went for the conferences, the information tables were valueable, and the commercial vendors were good.
- The financials are not complete, however, it does appear that we made money on the Expo.
- We all learned a lot from the Expo experience. More information will be discussed at the October club meeting.

Old Business:

- As a result of a vote at the July club meeting, the Education Committee will finalize all expenses related to education and get those covered by the end of the calendar year. That gives the Education Committee adequate time to review all education related expenses, and for the club to vote on them before the end of the year.
- There is no longer any work being done on updating the club bylaws. The bylaws are complete.

New Business:

• Steve WØSTV said that we need a generator for the 82 repeater. The other repeaters in town have backup power. The 82 repeater only has battery backup.

A generator should be purchased as club equipment. It should be stored with the other club equipment. In the event that the 82 repeater loses power the battery will keep it going while someone transports the generator to the repeater site and installs it. The generator could also be used for emergencies, Field Day, and other events.

The Technical Committee will look at the options that are available. Some recommendations were made that they look at the QST article on generators from a couple of months ago. Also, we should not need to spend a lot of money on a generator, but we should pursue getting one that has an inverter.

• Robert KØRDA requested that the club look into purchasing some Byonics Micro-Trak All In One APRS portable tracker units that could be loaned out to people for events or for SKYWARN storm spotting. The Micro-Trak All In One unit is based on the TinyTrak3, and sells for \$250 assembled. More information is available at the link http://www.byonics.com/microtrak/mtaio.php.

Robert also talked about a very small GPS unit built just for the Kenwood D710 radio by Green Light Labs here in Rochester. More information is available at the link http://www.greenlightlabs.com.

If we are going to do a 2009 Expo we need to get started on it now.
- Lots of lively discussion took place on what to do with the \$3600 raised by the Expo, and exactly who

the \$3600 belongs to. The discussions leaned towards using the money to fund the next Expo. Ultimately the debate ended with a motion that the RARC support another Expo in 2009. The motion passed.

This program has its own packet engine built in and works several digital modes, including APRS, RTTY, Oliva, and SS TV. The repeater has the ability to monitor different inputs, so Rob KC0FOW has built a circuit that will create a short condition when the temperature in the repeater cabinet reaches aprox 168 degrees. When that happens the repeater has been programmed to play a message "Danger High Temperature Alert, Call Control Operator" if you hear this please call one of the tech committee members. If the condition exists the message will play every 10 minutes until the temperature reaches a safe level. We are still doing some testing on the circuit and hope to have it operational soon.
- John NØHZN has offered to sell the club a "room temperature monitor" to install in the .82 repeater cabinet that will allow the tech committee to monitor the actual temperature inside the cabinet. By inputting the proper code, the repeater will read the actual temperature over the air. This will allow us to know the actual temp so we may know before it reaches the trigger temp that will play the High temp warning. John is asking for \$100 for the unit. The tech committee recommends that the club purchase the unit.

- 47 hams participated, manning stations for CW, SSB, VHF, Digital, and a GOTA (Get On The Air) station. There were 152 digital QSOs; 151 GOTA (the GOTA and digital stations were competing at the end, and the digital station won by a nose); 41 VHF; 335 CW; and 536 phone. With bonus points and the low-power multiplier (100 watts), our total claimed score is 4680 points. Comparing to last year's scores, this would have put us in the top 50 in the 3A category but last year was a poor-propagation year. Still, it's pretty good. There were visitors from Red Cross and the Dakota Division ARRL director, several people stayed all night, and the rain held off till the very end.
- Certificates were presented to Brad (KCØQVH), second place, and Paul (WDØGCP), first place, for the Portable Antenna Challenge.

• **BPL** - Mel (KCØP):

• Fred and Mel met with Joe Marsilli of Main.net. Their plan: they want a 3 month technical trial, starting this week. They will hook up all equipment, and test with about 10 subscribers. Later, there will be a 3 month marketing trial, for about 100 customers, possibly in the same general area. Status: they are installing this week. If you look, you can see the injectors and repeaters on the poles, a kleenex box sized thing with a wire up to the power line. A T1 fiber optic line from Winona connects to the injector, and repeaters are installed on transformers. There are lots of repeaters going in per mile, here. There will be an equipment change halfway through: they will start with DSSS (Direct Sequence Spread Spectrum), using frequencies between 2 and 30 MHz, or maybe 2 and 20, technical information is hard to get out of them. Three months later they will switch to OFDM (Orthogonal Frequency Division Multiplexing), smoother and better. The customer receive modem plugs into house wiring, not WIFI, as was used in Cedar Rapids. They can notch out frequencies from their server in Winona, or turn off repeaters, or change the power level, which is set now at 5 of 7 (units unknown). Their marketing pitch is that they have had no trouble in Germany, where 80000 "pieces" have been shipped. Observations: Baseline logging of noise levels has been done on 5 days. Four of the days were fairly quiet; the one day there was strong noise was also the one day the RPU team made background noise level measurements. Part 15 limits allow S9 + 15 Db noise, at 30 feet away from the source using a dipole. Also, the law prohibits "harmful interference", which is an operational definition, based on whether the receiving radio can be used. It isn't clear how the law will be interpreted.

• **Public Service** - John (NØHZN):

• There have been 6 events so far. The 3 bicycle events have all had really good participation. For every event we have served, the organizers have been enthusiastic and appreciative.

Then for a third test we took it to Stew's house and got the same results. Conclusion: the amp is bad. As of now we don't see any need to replace it. APRS is doing fine without it.
 - The Astron power supply at Simpson: Murphy's law is alive and well. When we removed the

amp from the Simpson site we had to turn off the power supply. When we were done we tried to turn it back on. No luck, the switch is bad. I contacted Astron and they are sending a new switch. Simpson is now running off the power supply that had been used for the remote base.






QRP - Low Power Amateur Radio

QRP is the "Q" signal meaning *lower your power/should I lower my power?* It has come to mean all low power operation, especially on HF. QRP operators have diverse interests -- CW, building, backpacking, mobile, contesting -- with the common thread ofdoing it with less than 5 watts. QRPp is sometimes used to refer to *extreme* QRP -- operating with less than one watt of power. QRPp is also called milliwatting.

The QRP aspect of amateur radio is growing in interest level. <u>Tony, AAØSM</u>, gave at presentation to RARC club members at the March, 2001, monthly meeting.

PSK31

PSK31 (Phase Shift Keying 31 Baud) is best viewed as a "high octane" cousin of RTTY (Radio Teletype). The PSK31 mode was invented by Peter Martine, G3PLX, who also brought commercial SITOR mode to the hams bands as AMTOR. For a few years, PSK31 languished in obscurity since special DSP hardware was necessary to use it. In 1999, however, G3PLX designed a version of PSK31 that needed northing more than a common computer sound card. By providing a a piece of software that runs under Windows to interface the sound card and the transceiver, the mode began to take off. An additional step in PSK31 popularity took place in 2000 with the debut of "paroramic" software programs such as Digipan and WinPSK. Both software packages make it extremely simple to get on the air with PSK31 by hooking up some cables and clicking your mouse.

In just two years, PSK31 has become the *Number One* HF digital mode for casual keyboard-to-keyboard operating. Although not an error free digital mode, it does offer excellent weak-signal performance. PSK31 has been embraced by the QRP (low power) community since a couple of watts and a simple wire antenna can be used to work stations throughout the United States and some DX.. PSK31 uses 30hz wide signals and low power transmitters. A basic PC is needed (486/66 or better) running Windows 95/98 and a standard SoundBlaster16 sound card.

Some frequencies on each HF band are commonly used for PSK31 operations: 14.070 Mhz, 21.070 Mhz, 7.035 Mhz, 3.580 Mhz, 28.120 Mhz and 10.142 Mhz.

At the April RARC club meeting, Dave (KØVH) and Bob (KCØIDR) gave a presentation and demonstration on PSK31 operations. A notebook computer, running PSK31 software, connected to a QRP 20 meter transceiver and a simple wire antenna. The simple setup was able to copy PSK31 stations from across the country.
