The Olmsted VE team licensed 5 new technician class Hams. They were invited to the June RARC meeting and our field day. We need to make them welcomed and supported in their new hobby. If you hear a new call sign, please make an effort to make contact with them and let them know people are on the air.

When more people do this, the better your chance to have a conversation on the air. There are HF and VHF nets during the week. You can do MT63 on VHF without a soundcard modem - 'acoustic coupling' works fine. meaning you can hold your HT up to the mic on your computer and copy it very well and do the reverse to transmit.

The Filmore and Olmsted County ARES groups jointly operated ham radio communications at the water stops at the medical tent, and on the mobile cart for the Med City Marathon. This year there were no commercial radios used. We had Ham radio, 800 MHz radio dispatch, phone texting, and calls, all working together to get information from and to the people that had it or requested it. We used computer ICS forms to time stamp, log, and organized information in a PDF format. This hybrid network was very effective using location tracking, weather updates, and event LEC and RFD dispatchers in the Comm-Van. The Med City event coordinator was impressed with how well we moved information back and forth. This is what training and teamwork can accomplish working together.

For June Olmsted ARES will use our field day at <u>Chester Woods Park</u> as a training session. This is a major event that will require coordination, and teamwork setting up and staying operational for 24 hours and then the take down. Please attend the June 13th RARC meeting to begin our organizing and coordinating.

ARES has taken over Olmsted/Rochester public service events. The ARRL Field Day and Rochester Fest parade are on the same day. I do not have the details but keep your field day sign-up schedule open to be available to work the parade that afternoon. This year we need a starting gate radio operator. Let me know if you are interested.

There is a question if the 147.255 repeater has intermittent problems. If you experience ineffective communications, call 254-3993 or email w0stv@yahoo.com with what you experienced, your operating location, your power setting and the ambient weather conditions at the time.

I want ARES to have the training you want to be an effective part of the team. Contact me at 254-3993 with request of what you want to learn. This summer there will be a need for radio operators for other events in Minnesota. I will forward the request for our assistance as I receive them for us to respond as a team for that event. This will be a great opportunity to work outside our county with other hams interreacting as a mutual assistance communications group.

June is a big month for Ham radio fun and includes both the VHF contest and RARC <u>Field</u> <u>Day</u>. If you like the digital modes then there's even something for you starting the first weekend.

- **June 3-4** ARRL International digital contest, this is an affliated club competition so we need your log to be submitted. Also read the rules on this one especially the **2 break** section. Logs must be submitted within 7 days.
- **June 10-12** ARRL June VHF contest, there are some changes to the rules for this one including 2 separate entrant classes. Participants can enter in either an all-mode class (including digital FT4/8) or an analog only class (cw/ssb/fm).
- **June 17-18** <u>All Asian DX Contest</u> CW, this contest is sponsored by the Japanese Amateur Radio League, the ARRL equivalent in Japan.
- **June 24-25** ARRL Field Day, We all familiar with contest/not contest event. **Taylor, WBØRSJ**, is coordinating RARC efforts again this year at <u>Chester Woods Park</u>. Check the <u>RARC web page</u> for updated information.

It's another full month of radio fun ahead in June. You can find out more about these contests and others on the <u>ARRL</u> and <u>WA7BNM</u> calendars.



CONTEST CORNER

Hams enjoy contesting for a variety of reasons. If you have kids or grandkids, then you know that online video games are very popular or even addictive. Yes, some of our youth seem to be surgically connected to their devices. Radio sport contesting also has many of these addictive elements of competitiveness. There are several web based "tools" that can help ham radio contesters gain a more competitive edge and enhance the thrill of the event.

Most of us are familiar with and use websites such as <u>DX Summit</u> and the <u>Reverse Beacon Network</u> (RBN) for spotting assistance or information on how we are being heard as well as evaluating station performance. While these two sites are similar, there are also some unique features that we could look at closer in the future.

Another website that can be used to improve on the performance enhancing elements of motivation, information and real time feedback is the Contest Online Scoreboard. This scoreboard is free to use, supports a wide variety of contests and can be seamlessly integrated with a contest logger such as N1MM. It provides real time ranking and scoring of peer stations. You'll have to set up an account and use the FAQs to get your logging program set up. If you use N1MM you can go here for additional help.

There are other scoreboards which offer more features but may also have a subscription fee associated with their service. I have used the Contest Online Scoreboard for more than a year on the weekly CWT mini contests as well as several RTTY contests and can attest to its benefits.



CONTEST CORNER

It is important to choose a scoreboard that meets your needs so you may want to explore them to find the one most suitable for your specific contest of interest.



POTA is a great way to enjoy Ham radio and enjoy the bonus of being outdoors!




